*Passed! S.2076 BOLD Infrastructure for Alzheimer's Act - Introduced on 11/67/2017 by Senator Susan M. Collins (ME)

Bill amends the Public Health Service Act to award cooperative agreements: (1) for establishment or support of national or regional centers of excellence in public health practice in Alzheimer's disease; (2) to state public health departments, Native American tribes, and other entities to promote cognitive functioning, address cognitive impairment and unique aspects of Alzheimer's disease, and help meet the needs of caregivers; (3) for analysis and public reporting of data on the state and national levels regarding cognitive decline, caregiving and health disparities, and monitoring of objectives on dementia and caregiving in the Dept. of Health and Human Services' Healthy People 2020 report.

Latest action: 12/19/2018 Passed House; ready for President

*H.R.2 Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 - Introduced on 4/12/2018 by Representative K. Michael Conaway (TX-11)

Farm bill reauthorizes through FY2023 and modifies Dept. of Agriculture programs that address commodity support, conservation, trade and international food aid, nutrition assistance, farm credit, rural development, research and extension activities, forestry, energy, horticulture and crop insurance.

Latest Acton: 12/20/2018 Signed by the President

*H.R.2422 Action for Dental Health Act of 2018 - Introduced on 5/15/2017 by Representative Robin L. Kelly (IL-2)

This bill amends the Public Health Service Act to reauthorize oral health promotion and disease prevention programs through FY2022. Text **HERE**

Latest action: 12/11/2018 Became Public Law No: 115-302.

*H.R.5075 Ashanti Alert Act of 2018 - Introduced on 2/20/2018 by Representative Scott Taylor (VA-2)

The bill directs the Department of Justice to establish a national communications network – the Ashanti Alert communications network – to support regional and local search efforts for missing adults.

Latest action: 12/20/2018 Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.

*H.R.6753 Strengthening the Health Care Fraud Prevention Task Force Act of 2018 - Introduced on 9/7/2018 by Representative Greg Walden (OR-2)

To amend title XI of the Social Security Act to direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish a public-private partnership for purposes of identifying health care waste, fraud and abuse 11/29/2018 Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance.

***S.3679 READI for Disaster Act** - Introduced on 11/29/2018 by Senator Robert P. Casey (PA) A bill to ensure that older adults and individuals with disabilities are prepared for disasters, and for other purposes.

11/29/2018 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

***S.3660 Health Equity and Accountability Act of 2018 -** Introduced on 11/27/2018 by Senator Mazie K. Hirono (HI)

A bill to improve the health of minority individuals and for other purposes. 11/27/2018 Read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

*H.Res.1183 – Providing for consideration of the Senate amendment to the House amendment to the bill (H.R.695) to amend the National Child Protection Act of 1993 to establish a voluntary national criminal history background check system and criminal history review program for certain individuals who, related to their employment, have access to children, the elderly, or individuals with disability and for other purposes. Introduced on 12/20/2018 by Representative Tom Cole (OK-4) 12/20/2018 Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.

*H.R.7328 Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness and Advancing Innovation Act of 2018

- Introduced on 12/19/2018 by Representative Susan W. Brooks (IN-5)

To reauthorize certain programs under the Public Health Service Act and the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act with respect to public health security and all-hazards preparedness and response, to clarify the regulatory framework with respect to certain nonprescription drugs that are marketed without an approved drug application, and for other purposes. 12/201/2018 Received in the Senate
